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Joanna Watson: Managing Teachers, Managing Change, a participative workshop looking at

change. The aims are to;

- explore the difficulties of managing change
- to share experiences of managing change

Language – a voluntary organisation working with refugees and asylum seekers.

Lindsay Clandfield: Programmes, platforms, projects (and pigeons!) (talk)

Information and communications technology (ICT) has revolutionized the way we live and work. But how much has it revolutionized language teaching? From apps to learning management systems, I'd say the C is largely missing from ICT. There is a danger that any gains we made towards communicative methodology could be brushed aside by technology. But technology might also save us. In this plenary we will explore some of the issues, questions and solutions to this dilemma.

Survival and fantasy projects for language classes (workshop)

This engaging and very practical workshop will look at use of classroom technology such as a projector and power point to help create multi-stage, multimedia projects involving role-play. Participants will take part in one such a project I developed called 'The Island', and we will examine how these techniques can be used to create a whole

variety of different scenarios, from simple business English teaching to fantasy settings such as a zombie apocalypse or an alien invasion.

Lindsay Clandfield is an award-winning writer, teacher, teacher trainer and international speaker in the field of English language teaching. He has written more than ten coursebooks and is the main author of the new young adult course **Studio** (Helbling Languages). His other courses include **Global** and **Straightforward** (Macmillan). he co-wrote with Jill Hadfield. Lindsay is also the creative force behind various web projects including the popular blog **Six Things**, the e-publishing collective **The Round** and the sci-fi/adventure materials website **Extreme Language Teaching**. Irena Žiger: What is Eaquals and what it means for us



In this brief talk Irena will present Eaquals as an international organisation in the area of quality language services, its aims and the benefits of being a member. Irena's school is a full member and CAFL is an associate member of Eaquals so she can speak from the point of view of a member and as an Eaquals inspector.

Irena Žiger is a teacher of English and Russian, teacher trainer and foreign language school manager, having run her own language school for 29 years. She has experience in teaching students of all ages, pre-school, teenagers and adults on different types of courses – general and specialised language. Irena is also Eaquals inspector, CAFL inspector and inspector trainer. She is currently Chair of CAFL.

The Croatian Association for Foreign Languages (CAFL) within the Croatian Chamber

of Economy is an association which has about a hundred members, mainly foreign language schools, but also other organisations and individual members who engage in foreign language teaching. The Association was founded in October 2002 with the aim of introducing international quality standards in foreign language teaching in Croatian, working towards the protection of its members as well as the recognition of their results within the system of foreign language schools.

One of the principal goals of the Association has been the introduction of quality system standards in everyday operation of schools, very much like Eaquals, the European association for Evaluation and Accreditation of Quality in Language Services, whose Associate Member CAFL has been for many years.

The Association uses its own scheme for inspecting quality in foreign language schools, which can easily be adapted for use in language departments at universities and other schools which want to accredit their language departments.

CAFL activities are aimed at raising quality and achieving a higher level of public visibility for its members - quality language services providers.
